## Getting Ready for Change: Complying with Substance Use Data Sharing

Effective March 31, 2019, specially protected substance use and behavioral health data (Part 2) will be integrated with other patient data in Rochester RHIO's health information exchange. This specially protected health information is known as SAMHSA or Part 2 data.

SAMHSA is a federal regulation and requires this type of data to have an extra layer of protection to protect patient privacy.

This seminar will inform you about the recent changes to the regulation, answer commonly asked questions, and offer tips to help with compliance. We'll also provide an information toolkit for you to take back to the office.
